- 5. Heterotrophs get energy from eating other organisms. Another name for heterotrophs is consumer.

- 9. Many overlapping food chains is an food web.

- 11. Where is the most available energy located in an energy pyramid? at the bottom or producer level.
- 12. Mushrooms are an example of a type of decomposer.
- 13. Photosynthesis Chemical Equation:

Water+ Carbon Dioxide+ Sunlight → Glucose + Oxygen
